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COVID-19 Financial Support Benefits Canada Recovery Benefit (CRB)

What is it? Income support if you are self-employed or are not eligible for Employment Insurance (EI).

Eligibility:

- There is no record of an application for the CRB having been made with the CRA for your account.
- Unable to work at least 50% of regular work week

Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit (CRCB)

What is it? Income support for anyone who have stopped work to care for dependents due to closures, high risk and caregiver availability.

- No record of an application for the CRCB having been made with the CRA for your account.
- Unable to work at least 50% of your scheduled work week because you are caring for a family member.

Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit (CRSB)

What is it? Up to four weeks of support if you are sick or must self-isolate due to COVID-19.

Eligibility:

- unable to work because they need to self-isolate due to COVID-19, or have an underlying health condition that puts them at greater risk of getting COVID-19
- There is no record of an application for the CRSB having been made with the CRA for your account.

Canada Child Benefit Young Child Supplement (CCBYCS)

What is it? A special one-time \$300 top up for families that are entitled to receive the Canada Child Benefit (CCB) with a net income of \$120,000 or less, for each child under the age of six.

Families that are entitled to the CCB with a net income of more than \$120,000 will receive \$150 per payment for each child under the age of six.

What is the Disability Tax Credit?

Are you eligible?

- The disability tax credit (DTC) is a non-refundable tax credit that helps persons with disabilities or their supporting persons reduce the amount of income tax they may have to pay.
- An individual may claim the disability amount once they are eligible for the DTC. This amount includes a supplement for persons under 18 years of age at the end of the year.

Who is eligible for the DTC?

You are eligible for the DTC only if you are approved Form T2201, Disability Tax Credit Certificate. A medical practitioner has to fill out and certify that you have a severe and prolonged impairment.

If a person was eligible for the DTC for previous years but did not claim the disability amount when they sent their tax return, they can request adjustments for up to 10 years under the CRA's Taxpayer Relief Provision.

To claim the disability amount for those prior years, you can ask for a reassessment.
